Township Spring Clean-Up



April 6th - 9th

The Portage Township Spring Clean-Up will be held Friday, April 6th thru Monday, April 9th. Dumpsters will be available and township employees will be on hand each day to assist residents. Metals will be separated for recycling purposes.

Friday and Monday: 7:00 am to 7:00pm Saturday and Sunday: 9:00 am to 5:00pm

Residents may dispose of household trash, tire rims, oil-free engine parts and small amounts of construction debris. Please do not cut Freon lines when bringing refrigerators/freezers to the Clean-Up.

The clean-up is intended to provide an opportunity for residents to dispose of accumulated household items. Disposing of mattresses has become very difficult as landfills do not want them. Until they are no longer accepted at landfills, the township will accept mattresses.

Remember it is not intended to be an opportunity for residents to cut remodeling and home renovation costs by disposing of siding, shingles, or excessive amounts of other building materials.

Commercially produced refuse will not be accepted. Daily household garbage will not be accepted, tires, asbestos, liquid waste, batteries, or yard waste. Your cooperation is very much appreciated and expected.

As always, proof of residency will be required.

Materials which do not comply with the above guidelines will be refused by the worker on duty.

All out-of-season items should be removed, including dead flowers and potting containers, plastic ornaments and flowers.

Any items people wish to keep should also be removed from the graves by March 23rd.

Grave decorations can be returned on March 31, 2018.

Any appliance or household object made primarily of steel including grills, mowers, etc. • No televisions, computers, plastic fans or vacuum cleaners, etc. • Refrigerators with food inside will not be accepted • Units containing Freon will be accepted at no charge



March for Meals

On March 22, 1972, President Richard Nixon signed into law a measure that amended the Older Americans Act of 1965 and established a national nutrition program for seniors

60 years or older: Meals on Wheels. Almost every community in America today is able to provide the program, Meals on Wheels.

Ottawa County Senior Resources will participate in the National March for Meals with a community month long event to showcase public awareness about senior hunger and isolation. Meals on Wheels also allows for a friendly visit with the recipient and check the safety of the senior in their home.

Home Delivered Meals are offered to residents of Ottawa County who meet the following criteria:

- 60 years of age or older
- homebound
- unable to participate in the senior dining site program
- unable to obtain food or prepare meals
- no adult living in the same building or area, able and willing to prepare meals

An in-home assessment must be completed to determine eligibility. Hot meals are delivered Monday through Friday. The suggested donation for the meals is \$3.00. No eligible person will be denied service because of failure to contribute all or part of the donation.

Ottawa County Home Delivered Meals program is offered to seniors through a partnership with Riverview Healthcare Campus, Area Office on Aging of Northwest Ohio, Inc. and the Ottawa County Senior Resources Department.
