Winter Ice and Snow, Take It Slow!

First Snow or Ice – Drivers usually aren't prepared for winter driving and forget to take it slow. Remember to drive well below the posted speed limit and leave plenty of room between vehicles.

Black Ice – Roads that seem dry may actually be slippery and dangerous. Take it slow when approaching intersections, off-ramps, bridges or shady areas. All are hot spots for black ice.

Township winter reminders:

Please assist the fire department in keeping the fire hydrant on or near your property clear of snow. Do not push snow up to the fire hydrant when cleaning snow away from your driveway.

Please make sure your mailbox is securely in place for the upcoming winter snow. It is the resident's

responsibility to make sure the mailbox is secure at all times. It is much easier to fix before it's too late...and the frigid weather is upon us!

Reminder...The Township Road Crew does not plow private roads in the township.



Winter Bird Feeding: The Basics

Just as you are planning for Holiday/Winter guests to your home, consider your backyard guests as well!!

Feeding birds is a great way to brighten a dreary winter day. It's also a never-ending source of entertainment and enjoyment. Action, color, drama, song; it's all there at your backyard bird feeder. You'll get to know the regulars and, if you're lucky, you'll be rewarded with surprise visits from birds not usually found in your area.

The type of seed you provide influences how many birds come to your feeder. Over 20 types of seeds are sold as birdseed. The best all-round is probably the small black-oil sunflower seed. It costs a little more but is preferred by many smaller species, including chickadees, nuthatches, and titmice. It has a high oil content that is nutritionally important for birds, and a thin seed coat that is easy for them to crack open. If you are going to provide

one seed, this is the one to choose.

"Marvel Meal," for birds is a mixture of peanut butter and other items, is fun for children to make and is a favorite of chickadees, titmice, wrens, and even bluebirds. It can be pressed into the holes of a log feeder or smeared directly onto the bark of trees. It can be spread on a pinecone and hung from a tree. It can also be frozen into blocks and put in a suet feeder or sliced into chunks and placed on a feeder tray. Recipe is below!

- 1 cup peanut butter
- 1 cup vegetable shortening
- 4 cups cornmeal
- 1 cup flour
- 1 handful of sunflower seeds (optional)


