

Township Winter News Bits

<u>Snow:</u> Please assist the fire department in keeping the fire hydrant on or near your property clear of snow. Do not push snow up to the fire hydrant when cleaning snow away from your driveway.

Inspecting Your Mailbox: You are encouraged to inspect your mailbox and posts for durability now. Your mailbox should be designed and constructed to stand up to the rigors of winter plowing season.

Christmas Tree Collection

LIVE Christmas trees will be collected the entire month of January. Remember to remove all decorations and tinsel from the trees. Trees must be at the edge of the road.

<u>Contamination and Holidays</u>News from the OSS Solid Waste Management District https://recycleoss.org OSS wants to keep clean and green during the holidays!!

Please make sure all your recyclables are empty clean and dry. If we keep the bins contamination free it will save valuable space in them which will be needed as our household waste increases about 25% during the holiday season.

There is no limit to the number of times an aluminum can is able to be recycled, as long as it isn't soiled with food remnants. Steel and aluminum cans as well as empty aerosol cans with the cap removed are welcomed in our bins.

Typically, plastic bottles and jugs are recyclable, but flexible plastics – like plastic bags and packaging materials – aren't. The only plastic items we accept are plastic bottles and jugs. Basic rule of thumb is that if the plastic item has a "neck shape" it can be recycled with us. We are happy to take glass bottles and jars but make sure to keep out any tempered glass. Tempered glass includes candle glass, window glass, dishes, cookware, drinking glasses, lightbulbs, or mirrors.

Reminder Again****Do not put anything in the ditches around or across your road! Keep it on your own property.
