If you have yard waste like grass clippings, plant material, and vegetation, you can drop them in the yard waste pile at the township complex. ## WINTER 2025

### BRUSH PICKUP



It happens, cold winds, snow and ice take down branches during the winter months. That is why the Portage Township maintenance crew continues to pick up brush piles on the first Tuesday of each month, even throughout the cold winter months.

Help our crew out by following the below guidelines:

- Branches should be less than 4" in diameter.
- To facilitate easy feeding into the chipper, please try to set branches near the road with the largest ends closest to the shoulder.
- The township chipper cannot safely handle beach debris or material such as stumps, rocks, dirt, nails, metal, or sand.
- During the fall months, please keep leaves separate from branches because they are collected using different equipment.

Remember -it's cold out there – let's make sure our crews don't have to stay out longer than necessary. Follow the guidelines!

### BIANNUAL TOWNSHIP CLEANUP

The biannual Portage Township cleanup will be on April 11- 12th from 9 am – 5 pm at the Portage Township Complex. Dumpsters will be provided for residents to dispose of accumulated trash. Township employees are on hand each day to assist residents in unloading.

Residents may dispose of accumulated trash, such as freon-free appliances, tire rims, oil-free engine parts, and small amounts of construction debris. The clean-up is intended for residents to dispose of household items that are not picked up by residential trash service.

Daily household garbage, tires, asbestos, liquid waste, batteries, or yard waste cannot be accepted. The clean-up is not intended for commercial use or for disposing of excessive amounts of home renovation and construction materials.
